

Catholic Educators

Catholic educators are dedicated to promoting Catholic values and fostering their students' spiritual growth. Through a well-developed pedagogy, they address students' academic, spiritual, and moral learning needs. They enhance programs by offering outreach opportunities for students to engage with the community and contribute to social justice projects. It is common to see high school students assisting with local food kitchens and food/clothing drives for the marginalized.

The relationship between learning and believing is fundamental in Catholic Schools. Catholic educators take on the responsibility of not only teaching essential skills and knowledge but also teaching Catholic virtue through careful attention to the Catholic Graduate Expectations of Ontario.



Catholic Trustees

In the province of Ontario, the Catholic education system is governed by locally elected officials called Catholic School Trustees. Our trustees hold an important role in Catholic Education, overseeing policies and procedures that guide the school boards in their operation. Catholic School Trustees are servant leaders, dedicated to representing the wider Catholic community in faith.

Chaplaincy



In the Diocese of Hamilton, we are blessed with Chaplaincy Leaders in our Catholic High Schools, alternative **learning** centres, and some elementary schools as well.

Chaplains play a vital role in fostering the spiritual growth of students and staff. They assist in deepening the understanding and practice of faith, provide emotional and spiritual offer guidance during support, difficult times, and work to create a nurturing environment.

Chaplains help build community within the school by promoting values such as compassion, respect, and service. They often collaborate with teachers to integrate faith-based perspectives into the curriculum, enriching the educational experience. Faith experiences are not limited to the classroom; chaplains provide enriching retreats and opportunities to engage with the community, supporting social justice and Catholic social teachings.
